BOARD MOTIONS:

The following motions were passed at the June 21, 2010 board meeting:

1. That the proposed 2011 budget be approved.
2. That \$5,000.00 be borrowed from the East Field account to assist with payment for the retaining wall and that the funds be repaid by Dec. 31, 2010.



MANAGER'S NOTES:

I did not anticipate updating you again on the retaining wall at the office as I thought the project would be complete or nearly so by now. There have been more delays with the primary one being the weather. An unusual amount of rain for July has definitely slowed the project. The footer has been poured and some of the rebar is in place. The next step will be, starting at the west end, to set the panels, place rebar and pass another inspection. With the first inspection done, 75 feet of the wall has been poured. Once that sections sets, the process will be duplicated for the remainder of the wall. Have you heard the names the area has been given? FLU / PNEUMONIA SHOT CLINIC

It is July and rather early to think about flu and pneumonia shots but through the efforts of resident Melody Gordon, arrangements have been completed for a clinic here at the Camp Ground. The clinic will be conducted in the Activity Building on Tuesday, October 5, 2010 from 9:00 a.m. to 4:00 p.m. The provider, Maxim Health Systems, suggests that participants contact their healthcare provider regarding coverage. Their past experience with coverage has been:

- Most Medicare Part B participants were not required to pay any co pay.
 - Non-Medicare participants were required to pay co pays as follows: \$25 for flu shot and \$45 for pneumonia shot.

ATTENTION: GOLF CAR OWNERS

This reminder is being included again this month due to a recent accident involving a golf car. Please review this yourself, if you own a golf car, and with anyone that operates it. Every season it seems there are more golf cars on the grounds. Rules regarding golf cars are in the "Traffic and Parking" section. A few highlights are:

- Golf cars are to be operated only by responsible drivers. Children should not operate golf cars without an adult seated beside them. At no time should anyone under the age of 16 operate a golf car without an adult present.
- Drivers will obey all traffic rules. (Stop Signs, 10 mph, Pedestrian Only and One Way Streets, etc.)
- Golf cars must have operational headlights and taillights/reflectors if used at night.
- You must register your golf car at the Camp Ground Office to obtain a free vehicle sticker.

WAYS TO MAKE PESTICIDE FREE MOSQUITO REPELLANT:

Here is a personal recipe that’s been used with success:

1 1/4 cup witch hazel and 1 Tbsp lemon eucalyptus essential oil

Mix in spray bottle. Shake well to remix before each application. Reapply every 1-2 hours.

- **Buy an essential oil.** The following essential oils are known to repel mosquitoes: citronella, clove, eucalyptus, peppermint, tea tree, lavender, lemongrass and cedar. To make any of these essential oils into a spray, combine 10 parts witch hazel, rubbing alcohol or mineral oil to one part essential oil.
- **Test a small area of your skin.** Most people don’t have a bad reaction, but you may be allergic to something. If it irritates your skin try using a different essential oil.
- **Reapply frequently.** These pesticide-free mosquito repellents are NOT water- or sweat-proof. Reapply at least every three to five hours to keep the scent strong and ensure continuous protection.
- **Empty anything that has water laying in it outdoors.** Don’t give them a place to hatch near your house.
