LADIES GAME NIGHT

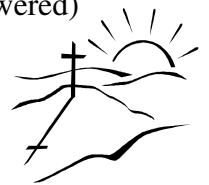

1. In order to begin splitting the firewood, you must contact the Camp Ground Office and make arrangements.
You will be given a permission slip. Anytime you are splitting wood, you may be asked to show this slip.
2. Firewood that is split is shared equally between the Camp Ground and the party doing the splitting.
3. The half of the firewood that is remaining at the Camp Ground is to be stacked neatly.
